American Arborvitae – Broad-based, upright, conical to pyramidal shaped often single-trunked, evergreen tree. Green, scale-like foliage in flat sprays that does not yellow in the winter. Great for windbreaks, screening, and tall hedges.



Norway Spruce – A graceful pyramidal with shiny, dark green needles. Beautiful spreading branches with drooping twigs. An extremely hardy tree that grows in most soil conditions. Makes a charming Christmas tree, an appealing ornament specimen, or a protective windbreak. Fast growth makes this spruce ideal for timber.



Scotch Pine – Scotch pine is conical to columnar when young, developing an open-rounded, irregular crown as it matures and growing 30-60' tall. Excellent Christmas tree.



Fraser Fir - A Native narrow, pyramidal, evergreen conifer with a spire-like crown. It grows to 30-50' tall over time with a spread of 10-25'.



American Redbud – A small flat-topped tree, producing pink blooms on bare stems in early spring. Foliage is large and heart shaped, changing to yellow in the fall. Does well in protected location.



Serbian Spruce - A stunning, graceful landscape tree. Beautiful as a single garden specimen or in groupings. Narrow, pyramidal, spire-like tree with pendant branches that ascend at the tips. Flattened bright green needles have silvery undersides. It grows to 50-60' tall by 15-20' wide in full sun to part shade.



Arctic Blue Willow – Landscape shrub growing 3-5' tall and wide best grown in average, medium to wet, well-drained soils in full sun to part shade. Prefers full sun.



Canadian Hemlock - Short, soft light yellow green needles in spring changing to glossy dark green. Likes moist, organic well-drained soils. Tolerates shade well. Does not tolerate drought and wind.



American Sycamore - indigenous to eastern North America. It is a deciduous, usually single-trunk tree that typically grows to 75-100' tall with horizontal branching and a rounded habit. Trunk diameter typically ranges from 3-8' and features brown bark which exfoliates in irregular pieces to reveal creamy white inner bark.



Elderberry – Great for jellies, syrups, pies, wines, and brandies. Native to eastern North America. It is a deciduous, somewhat sprawling, suckering shrub that typically grows to 5-12' tall. Prefers medium to wet, well-drained soils in full sun to part shade but tolerates a wide range of soils. Spreads by root suckers to form colonies.



Flowering Dogwood - A small, deciduous flowering tree that typically grows 15-30' tall and wide, with a low-branching, broadly-pyramidal but somewhat flat-topped habit. Bloom occurs in early spring in full sun or part shade.



Hazelnut - A large shrub known for its tasty nuts. It will reach dimensions of 15 feet tall and 15 feet wide, becoming arching and spreading with age. Thrives in full sun but tolerates partial shade. Great for dry or wet sites.



River Birch - A vigorous, fast-growing, medium-sized single or multi-stemmed tree with an open habit and gorgeous exfoliating salmon-pink to reddish brown bark showing a lighter inner bark. Native to Eastern US., grows 40-70' tall by 40-60' wide. Great for riverbanks, wet soils and adapts well to clay soils. Beautiful landscape specimen.



Scarlet Oak - Large deciduous tree with a rounded, open habit which eventually matures to 50-70' tall x 40-50' wide. Foliage is a glossy green in summer turning to scarlet in fall. Great shade tree.



Sugar Maple - A medium-sized, deciduous tree native to Eastern North America that typically grows 40-80' tall by 30-60' wide with a dense, rounded crown. This is the tree from which Maple syrup is made. Great shade and specimen tree with gorgeous fall color. Not a good street tree due to its shallow roots and intolerance of road salt and urban pollution.



Everbearing Strawberry Plants - Strawberries are one of the easiest fruits for the home gardener to grow and one of the most rewarding. This perennial blooms spring and summer prior to bearing fruit. Will produce large juicy berries throughout the summer. Comes bare-root.



Tulip Poplar - Eastern North American native that typically grows 60-90' tall by 30-50' wide with a pyramidal to broad conical habit. Trunks rise column-like with an absence of lower branching. This tree boasts cup-shaped, tulip-like flowers that bloom in spring. Flowers are yellow with an orange band at the base of each petal.



Asparagus - Unlike most vegetables, asparagus plants are perennial, which means the same plants grow in your garden year after year. The spears that we enjoy as a vegetable are the new shoots that emerge in spring. Delicious steamed or roasted. Comes bare-root.



Herb Garden - Eight Culinary herbs in a decorative basket planter. Includes Basil, Parsley, Chives, Cilantro/Coriander, Oregano, Peppermint, Sage, and Dill.
